# Memorial Day Spirit of Courage Award Salutes Our Heroes

The Youth of Honor Carl Brashear Memorial Fund team took time away from their families to travel and uplift the spirits of United States military men and women wounded during battle. As a part of this visit, each soldier was presented with a *"Spirit of Courage Award"* which bears the late Carl Brashear's quote "It's not a sin to get knocked down, it's a sin to stay down". The team soon realized that a trip that was intended to raise the spirits of these heroes of battle was truly a time when their tales of battle deeply touched each YOH team member.

With the United States in the middle of multiple battles on foreign soils, the daily sacrifices of those defending our freedom is sometimes forgotten. After sitting bedside with these brave war veterans the team heard first-hand of the daily challenges they faced and the extreme amount of pride they carried with them in serving our great country. They spoke of their brothers in arms still on the battlefield and their desire to return to duty to continue their mission.

During the Youth of Honor's visits to the military hospitals, time was also taken to talk to the hospital staff who spend countless hours supporting the wounded as well as their families. One colonel we spoke to took time to give us a tour of a family support center. Most people do not realize that when a wounded serviceperson is hospitalized, many times, the family will quit their jobs back home and come stay near their loved one. The emotional support this provides is tremendous for the rehabilitating soldier but carries with it a huge burden on the family. Jobs are lost, and in most cases, part of the family is still back at home trying to pay bills and cover things until their return.

Upon the conclusion of the event, the team promised the facilities that we would share with others our experiences and what we learned as without the work of our soldiers, the hospitals and the supporting families we would be living a lot different life.

Since Carl Brashear's passing on July 25, 2006, the outpouring of heartfelt condolences has been overwhelming. The family knew that Carl was a courageous man who rose statuesque to overcome obstacles in life, but they had no idea of the personal levels of impacts Carl would have around the world. This humble man from Sonora, Kentucky did not ask to be put on a pedestal but instead went about his daily business the best way he knew how. He loved the military and he especially loved being a U.S. Navy diver.

Realizing that Carl stood for more than a common man, the Brashear Estate has begun meeting with multiple museums around the world about displaying some of his artifacts. After only a few short conversations with the museum curators, it became apparent that Carl's life spanned many different segments to many others that those with physical handicaps can regain normal lives and achieve their dreams. He proved that pain as well as the doubts of others could be overcome once you put your mind to it. For these reasons and more, the Brashear Family is working tirelessly to enable Carl's life to be preserved for others.

It is the family's intent to put some of Carl's belongings on display so people from around the world can continue to be inspired by his spirit to overcome obstacles in life. It is the family's hope that his life will assist others in raising the bar for themselves and succeed to new heights. We all have it within us but sometimes need a spark to light the flame.
